Tissue Paper Flowers



What you'll need

- Scissors
- A pipe cleaner you might want to use green to look like a stem
- 2 sheets of A5 green tissue paper
- 4 sheets of A5 dark coloured tissue paper
- 4 sheets of A5 light coloured tissue paper

In this easy craft activity, you'll make beautiful blooming flowers with just tissue paper and a pipe cleaner! Perfect to give that extra spring to your home, as the sunnier months approach, you can do this activity with the whole family. Make some decorations that will liven up any room! Using three colours of tissue paper, you'll make a gorgeous twotoned flower. See page 2 for full instructions

Tissue Paper Flowers Step-by-step




First, neatly stack your tissue paper – so that the two green sheets are on the bottom, the four darker coloured sheets are in the middle, and the lightest colour is on the top.

Fold the stacked paper back and forth along a concertina fold, i.e., like a fan. Ensure that the green paper is on the outside for both sides, and that the coloured is safely folded inside.







Wrap the pipe cleaner around the middle of the fanned tissue paper – do this a few times to ensure the paper is secure.

Tissue Paper Flowers Step-by-step



Trim the edges of the fan using the scissors – this will form the petals! Make sure this is done on each of the fan's four corners.

Be careful here! Gently pull the innermost sheet of tissue paper up to the centre – try not to rip it! Repeat this on the other side of the fan and do this for each sheet of tissue paper.









You now have a beautiful tissue paper flower!
